LEARN

The Jersey Lilly was the name of the building where Judge Roy Bean had his saloon and court house. Judge Roy Bean was known as the “Law West of the Pecos.” He was the only lawman in Langtry, Texas, a small community that started during the construction of the railroad.



The original Jersey Lilly is still in Langtry and there is a Texas Department of Transportation Visitor Center where you can learn more about the Judge.

The Jersey Lilly was named after British Actress Lillie Langtry. The town of Langtry was named after George Langtry, a railroad engineer.
